New Regional and Thematic Networks for ReDi: Interdiac and CODE

Among the more positive news is the fact that the executive board of ReDi has welcomed one new regional network and one thematic network in addition to our previous networks within the organization. The networks do not have a formal role, but are welcome to advertise their activities on the website.

The new regional network is the interdiac Research Platform, which is an international, ecumenical platform for the research of diaconia and Christian social practice for Central and Eastern Europe. The platform brings together researchers and practitioners across the region annually for an exchange concerning research, which will contribute to the development of the field. The new thematic network is the CODE Forum, which brings together researchers and practitioners in the field of community development and diaconia. It is a multidisciplinary network with broad international participation. CODE Forum seeks to support research that explores the theory, theology and practice of community development, involving faith communities, civil society and other local actors.
