Dear member of ReDi,

We trust that you are in good health. The corona pandemic is slowing down in some countries but it remains a worldwide challenge. Diaconal work is present in many ways in assisting and comforting people. The first studies on churches becoming more diaconal through the pandemic are published. There is much to learn, and it will be very interesting to see how diaconal work will develop and adjust to new challenges. This might also be a topic for regional ReDI groups: comparing lessons learnt from the pandemic.

ReDi Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of ReDi took place on 8 November 2021. This was the second annual meeting, as the first one in September did not reach quorum and had to be postponed. The online meeting had a total of 17 participants. The activity report and annual accounts of 2020 were presented and approved, and new suggestions for the ReDi membership fees were discussed. The new suggestion entails reduced conference fees for institutional members, as well as reduced fees for students and institutional members from the Global South. The annual meeting voted in favour of the suggestion.

Reports from Practice – Briefs from Research Projects and Practice

We have renamed the webpage "Reports from Practice" (under the heading "News" on our website) to "<u>Briefs from research projects and practice</u>," with the same goal of posting any relevant contributions from the field. The submitted write ups may include, but not limited to:

- Description of an ongoing research project
- Description of an innovative or current approach to practice
- Discussion of a research theme or issue which affects practice or arises from it
- Summary of a research process
- Summary of a recently concluded research project
- A brief essay on challenges and innovations relevant to the practice and research in diaconia

Not only is the expectation of briefs less formal, but we also hope that by using the concept of briefs and not reports, we will encourage contributors (practitioners) to participate in the ongoing process of knowledge sharing and knowledge production.

MoU with Diakonia World Federation

Redi has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Diakonia World Federation. The MoU is designed to develop the relationship between ReDi and DWF and facilitate the common working between the two organisations on areas of mutual interest. It outlines principles of co-operation on which to develop common activities, which will be developed when opportunity arises.
