CODE Webinar online, 19th April 2024

The CODE-Diaconal Community Development is holding a webinar on Future Directions for Political Diaconia. The webinar will take place on April 19th, 2024, 09.00 – 12.00 CET (10.00 – 13.00, EET; 08.00 – 11.00, BST). The theme of the webinar is: The present crises of growing inequality and marginalisation as well as global heating, the pandemic and war and civil conflict are big challenges which affect those with whom diaconia works. They also present a challenge for diaconal identity and practice. As one response to the challenges, nationalism and populism are taking root and it is

The CODE Forum brings researchers and practitioners together around approaches which relate community development and diakonia. It is a space for the exchange and development of research and practice. The CODE Forum has wide international and interregional participation and it is linked to the CODE research group at VID, Norway. The seminar will be held in Prague, Czechia, from the 17th to the 20th of September 2024. Main Themes of the CODE Forum 2024: 1. Community Development and Diaconal Identity in Changing Neighbourhoods. 2. Community Development and Human Agency Facing Rising Migration, Camps and Settlements. More information will come soon.

## **University of Eastern Finland Summer School**

UEF Summer School will be back 5-16 August 2024 with new courses at Joensuu campus, Eastern Finland. The course theme is: The Futures of Daily Bread? Food, Inequality, and Utopia. Course dates: 5-9 August 2024 (1 week). Course extent: 5 ECTS. Course coordinator: Anna Salonen (anna.salonen@uef.fi), contact person Annika Juurikka (annika.juurikka@uef.fi). The course familiarises the students with social factors behind contemporary food inequality, including food (in)security, abundance, food waste, and paradoxes of charitable food assistance. These social factors are discussed within the ethical and theological frameworks of food and eating, as well as planetary, cosmopolitan, and critical theologies, and utopian thought. The theoretical explorations are applied in a practical workshop on alternative food futures. Through critical, analytical, and creative exercises, the students acquire skills to apply utopia as a method and pedagogy. The course includes research literature and expert lectures that engage the students with participatory, ethnographic, and collaborative methodologies on studying food, inequality, and utopia. The course includes an excursion to a local sustainability project. You can find more information here.
